

Thoughts from Pastor Emeritus for March



Dear Friends in Christ,

It is my hope to write you a newsletter at least every quarter. I haven't wrote to you this year, but last October (2024), I agreed to stay on as Immanuel's Vacancy Pastor, the Visitation Pastor, and the Worship Planner, in that for now, I chose the hymns and the order of service for most worship events.

March is upon us and with the coming of March we usually get warmer temperatures (we hope!), more wind, and longer days. To that end, we start **Daylight Savings Time Sunday March 9.** This year we begin our Lenten journey on **Ash Wednesday, March 5**. During the Wednesdays of the month we will continue our Lenten Services at 7:00 pm, with our other Wednesday events with dinner at 5:30; Bible Study and Bells beginning at 6. During Lent we are reminded that we come with empty hands before a loving and gracious God. We bring nothing to the table except our sins and our disobedience to God's commands. All that we have, both physically and spiritually is simply a gift from God. As our Creator, He gives us all things to sustain us. As our Heavenly Father, He forgives us our sins, not based on what we have done, but for the sake and on account of our Lord Jesus Christ Who paid for our sins with His death on the Cross.

This year's Lenten Theme is "Places of the Passion." These scenes of Lent are familiar, The Upper Room, the Garden of Gethsemane, the halls of Pontius Pilate, and the hill of Golgotha—these are the places we remember when we meditate on our Lord's Passion. Yet when Jesus enters a place, He never leaves it as He found it. The most troubling places in our lives become the most amazing places of God's grace when Jesus visits them.

For this reason, in our midweek Lenten series, we will read and contemplate Luke's account of our Lord's Passion. Each week, we will read a different section of the story; and each week, Luke will take us to a different place, the places of the Passion.



Our focus, however, will not be on these physical places. Instead, we will gaze in wonder on the spiritual work that our Lord does there. Jesus will share His strength in our times of weakness. He will fill us with His praise in the midst of our sorrow. Week after week, we will enter the places of the Passion only to discover our Lord . . waiting for us . . willing to share with us a love that was set in place before the foundations of the world. Plan to come to our Lenten services this year. Prepare to enter into these places of devotion, for there, your Lord will meet you, sharing with you His wondrous love that saves a fallen world.

We live in a world filled with sin and evil. Satan and the forces of evil are alive and well within our world. Christians are being killed for their faith throughout the world. Historic Christianity is still being attacked daily on Social Media and with many in our national

media. Saint Paul reminds us that this battle in not with the powers of this world, but with Satan and his army. We fight this battle with the Armor of God—by studying His Word, by strengthening our faith in worship and by our fellowship with one another. Come this Lenten time. Come to the Lord and be refreshed, renewed, and forgiven. May God bless you all this month!

I wanted to write to give everyone an update on how our Call process is going. Just a reminder that our Call Committee consists of myself, Deborah Allen, Michael Hogan, Scott Kastner, Ron Lee, Scott McCay, and Laura Schaulat.

We have met numerous times the past few months. We finished the Congregational Self Study, Lay Leaders Questionnaire, and Congregational Checklist documents required by synod for a Call. In December, we met with our Circuit Visitor Rev. Ron Simpson to make sure we were on the right track and discuss our next steps.

Rev. Simpson facilitated a meeting between our committee and Oklahoma District President Rev. David Nehrenz. We presented him with our documents, other requested information, and our current vacancy plans. The committee had a very good discussion with President Nehrenz about our options and answered our questions. He informed us that we could explore three options for filling our pastoral vacancy:

- 1. We could Call a pastor from another congregation.
- 2. We could request a graduating candidate from seminary.
- 3. We could request a convertible vicar who would perform their vicarage year at Immanuel and then Call them at the end of their vicarage with Immanuel.

The Call Committee is still exploring all options right now. We did ask President Nehrenz to inform the Synod at the Council of Presidents' meeting earlier this month that Immanuel may be considering a graduate or vicar. We will meet the last week of February to make our final determination if we will pursue this route for certain or move forward with making a Call from the field.
