

Thoughts from Pastor September 2024




Dear Friends in Christ,

90 years; it was 90 years ago in 1934 that Immanuel was recognized as a member of The Lutheran Church Missouri-Synod. However Ron has found evidence that ministry in our neighborhood may have begun as early as 1926. I remember flying to Portland, Oregon in 2006 for my Aunt Mattie's 90th birthday. In 2006 I had been an ordained pastor for 16 years and I knew that 90 years is a special milestone, especially for people. It is also an historic milestone especially for churches. In Oklahoma City not only have a number of Christian Churches closed, but many of our fellow LCMS churches as well. Every Tuesday, I return from my chiropractor in Edmond by way of the Broadway extension and come to the church down 36th street, I past the flattened corner at 36th and Walker where the once proud First Christian Church with thousands of members once stood.

In my early years at Immanuel, Pastor Hall shared with me that the Oklahoma District in the 1970's gave Immanuel permission to leave our neighborhood and move to the suburbs, like our sister church Zion. But the members of Immanuel voted to stay the course at 36th and Indiana. Now, some 50 years later we are still here!

On **September 22**, we will celebrate our 90th Anniversary; in those 90 years, Immanuel has survived a World War, wars in Korea and Vietnam and in the Middle East, we have survived the so-called white flight of the 70's, and now in 2020 we have survived Covid which has cost us about a third of our members. So come on **September 22** and celebrate with your fellow Christians all those who have supported and fought for Immanuel these last 90 years! May our cry be today the same as 50 years ago: "Stay the course!" Our preacher on that Sunday will be Joyce's son, the Rev. Paul Kaldahl, a native Oklahoman and former member of Immanuel.

September is an exciting month. On **September 4**, Immanuel will continue **Family Nite**. As always, there will be adult Bible Studies and, of course, Sara Cage will begin the **Handbell Choir**. I know last year's choir worked hard and did a marvelous job. If you think you might be interested just let Sara know and come and be ready on **September 4**th. DON'T FALL FOR IT! DON'T BE DECEIVED!

Pastor's article notes our anniversary and how we maintain our presence in this area when others have departed or dissolved. Coupled with that is Saint Paul's admonition to the Ephesus church: Let no one deceive you with empty words..... (Ephesians 5.6a)

For almost 100 years, and formally 90, this congregation has tried to keep the truth of God's Word ----His Law and His Gospel ---- at the center of our proclamation and worship. That is no small feat, especially when looking around at those who have given up or have fallen prey to the secular views of this world. Notwithstanding the formation and direction of the ELCA, other denominations have cratered to the ways of pagans and are more aligned with the ancient Molech cult than with Christianity. If all would keep true to God's Word, then God bless them; however, we see far too often a departure from the Word and true Christianity in favor of "inclusion". Don't be deceived! God does not change His word.

Let's not be timid here. Jesus has declared He is the only way, the truth and the life and no one comes to the Father (God) except through Him. (John 14.6) He stated: If you love Me, you will keep My commandments. (John 14.15) It's not that our congregation is the only place where God's Word is properly proclaimed ---- but we are surely one who does so and maintain His commandments, His word, even in the face of disparagement from others. We do not just give lip service to Jesus, but for 90+ years preach and stay with what He said and did. His atoning sacrifice on the cross for us. Praise God for this honor of service.

In Ephesians, Paul warns that those falling into deception then fall prey to the sons of disobedience and God's wrath will come upon them. (Eph.5.6b). Take no part in those works of darkness, Paul warns in 5.11. Walk not as unwise, but as wise since the days of this evil world (where sin manifests) are numbered. (Eph.5.15-16)

Churches which have fallen for gay "marriage" or support abortion have deviated from the Holy Writ. The destruction of children through abortion is now praised, applauded or encouraged by many in society. Woe to them! Such is precisely the Molech cult of the Old Testament. They are in darkness and have the empty words Paul warns against.

Paul's Ephesians letter (5.6-21) tells us to walk as children of the light and to have no part in those works of darkness. We can warn the disobedient about the Law and even proclaim the Gospel to them, or pray for them, but do not become a part with them to where we are then tempted to abandon God's Word. So, be forewarned, let no one deceive you.

May this congregation always give thanks to God the Father in the Name of Christ Jesus and continue to submit to one another in reverence to Christ. (Eph. 5.20-21). The 90th anniversary is just a number; what counts is whether we follow the One with the words of eternal life. Jesus of Nazareth, the Christ, the Holy One of God; our risen Lord and Savior.

From the Past to the Present

90TH ANNIVERSARY HISTORY

THE THEME VERSE:

Exodus 15:2 (ESV)

The Lord is my strength and my song, and He has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise him, my Father's God, and I will exalt Him.

THE CHURCH:

In 1934, a few families from Zion Lutheran Church, with a family from a dissolved Swedish Lutheran Church, formed the nucleus of what is now Immanuel Lutheran Church. With help from Zion Lutheran Church members and other Christians, a wood frame chapel was built at Northwest 34th and Barnes, where the congregation worshiped until 1937. In 1936, lots at Northwest 36th and Indiana were purchased, and in 1973 the wood frame chapel was moved to that location. In 1940, a parsonage was built on the west side of the church. That parsonage would serve the Schmidtke family, the Streufert family, the Hall family, and the Steenbock family, before being demolished in 1998.

The congregation continues to meet in the little wood frame church until the current sanctuary was built and dedicated on February 21, 1954. Using a water tower air colling system, it was one of the first air-conditioned churches in Oklahoma City. After serving as a worship center and classrooms, the old wood frame church was finally torn down. Today, a memorial tree and marker that are dedicated to those lost in the 1995 Murrah Building bombing, rests on the site of the old church. In 1962, the fellowship hall and education wing were added, and in 1993, and addition was added to the northwest corner of the education wing, which included a new entry hall, a music room, a restroom, and a storage room. Through the years improvements were made, classrooms were remodeled, stained glass windows were added behind the alter and in the sanctuary and later in the classrooms. Many generations have added to the physical plant of Immanuel, yet the greatest gifts have always been Immanuel's people.
